

Descendants of Nicholas Kan(n)

1. **Nicolas Kan** b. 1692, Probably Southern Germany,¹ m. in Germany. **Catherine**, b. 1693. Nicolas died cir 1764, prob Hellam Twp., York Co., PA. A very earlier settler west of the Susquehanna River authorized by Samuel Blunston license (first issued 11 Jan 1733).

A KAN or KANN" genealogy book is contained in the genealogy section of The Historical Society of York County Library. It reports that the Kan family roots were in southern Germany near the German-Swiss border. The Reformed German Church, which separated from the Catholic Church, declared separate beliefs from the Lutherans. As early as 1690, the German Reformed people began to leave their homeland, due to religious persecution, by fleeing down the Rhine River to Rotterdam. Many came to New York, but due to heavy taxes, later moved to Pennsylvania. Nicolas however, emigrated direct to Philadelphia on the ship "Samuel" arriving on August 17, 1733 (PA. German Pioneers by Strassburger and Hinke, Genealogical Publishing Co., 1980), with his wife, Cathrina and four children: Gorg Michal(12), Hendrick(8), Johannes(3), and Dorothea, aged 6 months. They settled, in what is now Hellam Township, on 200 acres granted by Thomas Penn on October 30, 1736.

Henry Konn, York County, was naturalized on 10 April 1753 at the Supreme Court, Philadelphia as recorded in PA Arch. Second Series, Vol. II, pg.388.

The Court records at West Chester contain a document "Chester County Plot" containing the names of German settlers West of the Susquehanna River that includes a Nicholas Cone. This probably is this person.

This land passed to his son Heinrich. A York County deed in Deed Book "C", pg. 13 of 22 Aug 1764 shows that Nicholas Kann and his wife Sophina sold 200 acres to Henry Kann in Hellam Twp. for 539 pounds (English currency).

A tract of 253 acres is shown on the 1810-12 Plan of Springettsbury Manor owned by Henry Kann. Although the son Heinrich died in 1798 this is undoubtedly the same tract with a possible addition. The tract on the 1810 Plan is actually scaled at 271 acres.

The original tract shown on the 1810 Plan may also have been passed to John Heinrich, son of Gorg Michel. Although he was born in Dover Township, it is possible that he returned to Hellam Twp. More research is needed on deeds to trace the ownership of this tract.

The land is located east of the Stony Brook overpass for a distance of 0.9 miles and extending north to the new US 30 bypass. It encompasses the development of "Yorklyn". It is on the Springettsbury Twp. side of the boundary with Hellam Twp.

It is to be noted that the grant of this land in 1736 preceded the founding of York in 1741 and the creation of York County from Lancaster County in 1749. The survey of Springettsbury Manor was approved in 1722 and some historians believe the first settlers crossed the Susquehanna River and settled the area starting in about 1728. Thus, Nicolas Kan was undoubtedly among the first families to arrive. The Johann Shultz house in Stony Brook was built in 1754. and still stands, after its restoration. Stony Brook Mennonite Ch. is close.

Nicolas Conn is on the bounty list for whom Maryland authorities wanted for arrest and delivery for trial due to the dispute between Maryland and Pennsylvania over jurisdiction (Archives of Maryland, Vol XXVIII, William Brown, Editor, pgs. 102-103). His bounty was 10 pounds sterling. Thomas Cresap was issued arms to remove the German settlers. His arrest in December 1736 and imprisonment in Philadelphia caused matters to quiet down.

"Kann" is a German name meaning or derived from "Dweller at the sign of the jug, sometimes carved on doors of homes of Levites , since it is the duty of the Levites to pour water over the hands of the priests before they bless the congregation.

Information on the KANN families is in part taken from "Evidences of the Kann Families of York County before the year 1850", Vol. XXVII, pgs.13-38, by Henry James Young, Director, HSYC, 1942.

Among persons who undersigned Rev. Jacob Lischy's Pastoral Record, Reformed Congregations at York, Kreutz Creek, Conewago and Bermudian.

Also researching this surname is Gene King, 2050 Eastern Blvd., York, PA 17402.

Nicholas and his son, Georg Michael Kann were signers of an agreement dtd 17 Mar 1745 to build the first Reformed Church, York, Pa.

IGI data shows following additional children baptized in Insheim: Johannes Michael, b. 1715; Maria Eva, b. c 1726; and Maria Catharina, b. c 1728. If in fact they are of this family they probably died as infants since they are not on the ship list with the other four siblings. Catherine: Was she a Spengler?

- 2. **George Michel Kann** b. 1721, Germany, m. **Maria Barbara**, d. 1778. George died ~~30 May 1757~~, buried: Prospect Hill Cem., York, PA.²

George Michael Kam (sic) was naturalized at the Supreme Court in Philadelphia on 10 April 1760 as recorded in PA Archives, Second Series, Vol II. pg. 402.

Prowell's History of York County states that a Michael Kann was a prominent person who was a member of the Reformed Congregation of York county before 1754. Rev. Jacob Lischy came to York in 1744 as a visiting missionary and he reported 300 members of the Reformed faith in York and vicinity. After service as a Reformed pastor he withdrew in 1760 and organized an independent church in Codorus Twp. The above cited Michael Kann had Kann descendants leading in four generations to Rebecca Kann, wife of Emanuel K. Billet.

The "Kann" Genealogy Book at the HSYC shows that the couple had 10 children. However, eleven are listed herein. They raised the family on a farm near Admire, Dover Township, York County. Admire Road runs from Davidsburg Road, south of Dover, to East Berlin Road.

He died intestate. Administration Bond in Book "A", pg.250, for estate of George Michael Konn; Barbara and Henry Konn, Administrators. Inventory dated 14 April 1762. Account filed 19 August 1766 showed balance of 185+ pounds, distributed among widow Barbara and issue George, Maudlin, Michael, Elizabeth, Catharine, John, Henry, and Peter. Guardians Henry and Michael Konn of Hellam Twp. were appointed for his minor issue: Maudlin, Michael, Elizabeth, Catharine, and John (all above 14) and Henry and Peter (both under 14). A petition shows he left 200 acres in Dover Twp. (O/C "B", 131). The land was valued at 140 pounds and was decreed to son George (O/C "B", 137 of 26 Mar 1767).

Deed "2J", pg.525 of 12 June 1780 conveyed 39 acres to John Davis, which was a part of the plantation of the decedent, Michael Kann, of Dover Twp. for 5 pounds. Deed names as issue of Michael: George; Michael; John; Magdalena, wife of Andrew Grass; and Elizabeth, wife John Davis. The land was located on Canal Road southwest of Dover near Davidsburg Run.

Although formerly of York and Alexandria, VA, he died in his 87 th year at the residence of his granddaughter Miss Ann M. Logan in Charlottesville, VA.

York County, PA. Heinrich died 24 Apr 1798, York County, PA,¹⁴ buried: Kreutz Creek Ref. Cem. Hellam Twp.

A Henry Konn of York County was naturalized on 10 April 1753 at Supreme Court in Philadelphia (PA Archives 2nd Series, Vol II, pg.388), where listed as a Quaker (?).

Listed as 1762 member of Kreutz Creek Reformed Church.

Listed in York Co. Tax List of 1762, Hellam Twp. (SCPGS Spec. Pub. 5).

The Tax List of York County for 1779 shows Henry Cann of Hellam Township owned 237 acres and that he was taxed 105+ pounds. He owned 4 horses and 6 cattle. In 1782 he was taxed on 237 acres in Hellam Twp.

The first Census of York County (Taxables of 1783) shows he owned 257 acres, 2 horned cattle, 4 horses, and 2 sheep for a total valuation of 669 pounds for which he was taxed 12 pounds.

The 1790 Census of Hellam Twp. shows a Henry Conn along with two other males over 16 and one female.

A Henry Kann is shown on the 1810-1812 Plan of Springetsbury Manor as owning 253 acres located on the York-Lancaster Road (immediately east of present day Stony Brook). The tract had been patented (deeded) by the Proprietaries of Pennsylvania (sons of William Penn). It is recorded that Nicholas Kan and his family settled in Hellam Township between 1733 and 1736 on 200 acres granted by Thomas Penn on 30 Oct 1736. The land undoubtedly is this tract. However, Henry Kann sold to Andrew Ferree 240+ acres in 1796 for 3300 pounds (Deed "2L", pg.423), that was part of the 253 acres patented to Henry on 14 April 1768 and called "Chesnut Level".

His will dated 4 June 1796, probated 24 April 1798 names the 11 children (Will "J", pg 423). The accounting filed 24 May 1800 showed a balance of 3430+ pounds. Executors were George Bard and Adam Bahn.

He may have been the Henry Konn appointed by Orphans Court to assess the value of the estate of the late John Freighler and who reported same on 26 Aug 1761. Also on the panel were Philip Caspar Spangler, John H. Strickler and Michael Bardt.

Anna: Listed in S&H as Hanna Mela Porterren, age 8, on Adventure (1732) Family resided in Codorus Twp.

He remained a member of this unit until 1780 when it became part of the 6th Company (Capt. Jacob Comfort) of the Third Battalion. He saw actual service guarding prisoners of war at Camp Security in York County from December 1781 to January 1782 in a detachment under command of Captain Pennington. For this service he received 5 pounds pay and 5 pounds 10 shillings bounty.
 He may be the John Conn shown as single on the 1782 Hellam Twp. Tax List.

It is reported that he remained a member of this unit until 1780 when it became part of the Sixth Company (Captain Jacob Comfort), Third Battalion, YCM. per an updated return of 1780-1783 (Pennsylvania Archives, Sixth Series, Vol. II, pg 485).

(1) 27 Oct 1767, in First Reformed Church,York,PA,²² **Catherine Spengler**, b. 1748, York County, PA, (daughter of Rudolph Spengler and Barbara) d. bef 1806, Dover Twp., York Co., PA. m. (2) 11 May 1806, in First Trinity Reformed Ch.,York, PA,²³ **Anna Mary Koenig**, b. prob 1764, 6 May 1764, Kreutz Creek Luth.Ch.Hellam Twp.,²⁴ (daughter of Michael Koenig and Margaret) d. 24 Nov 1823, Conewago Twp.,York County, PA, buried: Strayer's Cemetery,Dover Twp. ²⁵ George died 29 Aug 1820,²⁶ buried: May's Meeting House Cem.,Dover Twp. ²⁷ Baptism at Strayer's Ch. by Rev Lischy, sponsors:George Amend & Anna Catharin or possibly Maria Catharine. Date in Lischy record is 23 Mar 1745.

He was baptized by Rev. Jacob Lischy, but the location is uncertain. A record of the baptism shows at Yorktown, Strayer's (Salem) Reformed Church in Dover Township, and at First Reformed Church, York.

He and Catherine Spangler, daughter of Rudolph Spengler, were married by Rev. William Otterbein at First Reformed Church, York. They lived on his father's farm until 1788.

On 30 May 1757 28 members of the German Lutheran and German Reformed Congregations, including George Kann,entered into an agreement for the purpose of founding a church, which became Salem or Strayer's Church.

The Tax List of York County for 1779 (reprinted from Pennsylvania Archives) shows a George Konn of Dover Township with 160 acres for which he was taxed 50 pounds. He owned 2 horses and 4 cattle. The 1780 Tax List shows 150 acres. His land was west of Bull Road and north of Butter Road next to lands of Henry Shaffner, Andrew Gross, Wendel Gross and Peter Haller. It was a short distance due west of Bethany Church and Cemetery. The hand drawn connected plat map at the HSYC shows lands of George Kann north of the Little Conewago Creek and a slight distance east of Salem Church Road. It is now occupied by Sunrise Acres subdivision.

The first Census of York County, "Taxables of 1783", published in part in Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd Series,XXI,pgs. 662-820, shows that George Kann of Dover Township had 190 acres, 1 house, 1 outhouse, 4 horned cattle, 3 horses, and 8 sheep. The tax list shows 3 males and 6 females in the residence. His valuation was 188 pounds and his tax was 5 pounds, 9 shilling, and 10 pence.

George Cann is listed in the 1790 Census of Dover Twp. with one other male over 16, three males under 16, and six females.

In Feb 1800, George Conn held Lot 19 on North Duke St between High St. and Philadelphia St., York.

He was elected an Elder of First Reformed Church, York on 1 January 1818 and in 1820.

He died intestate. Administration Bond "2F", pg.600 of 8 Sep 1820 shows that George Kann of York and Jacob Kann of Dover Twp. were administrators for estate of George Kann, Sr. of Dover Twp. The inventory was filed 28 Oct 1820.. The account filed 9 October 1821 showed a balance of \$4509+ and petition of 6 Nov 1820 states he owned 160 acres in Dover Twp., left a widow, Anna Mary, and 17 living children as follows: John; Barbara, wife of Samuel Kochenour; Susanna, wife of Adam Beib (Bob); Catharine, wife of Abraham Meyer; Molly, wife of Henry Boyer; George; Henry; Michael; Lydia, wife of Elijah Bull; Mary, wife of Andrew Newman; Juliana, wife of Frederick Miller; Jacob; Sabina; Sarah, wife of Jacob Ruppert; Lovey; Freney; Leah; and Elizabeth deceased wife of Jacob Ashenfelter. Elizabeth who died before her father left issue Peter and Catharine Ashenfelter (O/C "N", 103). Guardians were appointed for Freney and Leah (both over 14) and for Catharine Ashenfelter by O/C "N", 111.

George Kann and others paid 5 shillings for 3/4 acres for a burying ground to George Gauff et al. (Deed "3A," 539).

George Kann of Dover Township was a private in the First Class, Third Company (Captain John Schaeffer), First Battalion, York County Militia according to a return dated 11 April 1778. He remained with this unit until 1780 when it became the First Company of Peter Spiess. Sixth Battalion. He paid exercise fines incurred 1781-1782. amounting to 1 pound and 16 shillings. On 2 Feb 1778 he was paid 66 pounds for hauling militia baggage (Pennsylvania Archives, 3rd Series, Vol VII, pg. 105).

Listed in Capt. John Sharp's 3rd Company of 3rd Batt in 1786, 1787 and 1788 with other Dover Twp. men including; three Leather (Latter) brothers; John, Jacob and William Shatron and Frederick, Casper and George Spahr.

Baptized by Rev Jacob Lischy but location uncertain. Shows at Yorktown, Strayer's (Salem) Reformed Church in Dover Twp. and First Reformed Ch. York. Rev. Lischy's record in Kreutz Creek Register shows baptism at Bermudian. Elected elder of First Reformed Ch., York, PA on 1 Jan 1818 and 1820. Catherine: Married by Rev. William Otterbein Deed "2P", 478 of 13 Mar 1787 show Catharine, wife of George Kann, and daughter of Rudolph Spangler of Paradise Township, joined others in signing a release. Anna: Married by Rev. Geistweit Will in Book "P", pg. 96 dated 4 Oct 1823; probated 13 Dec 1823 with Jacob Conn and Elijah Bull, executors. The will refers to children and step children. Anna Maria Conn of Conewago Twp was the widow of George of Dover Twp. Elijah Bull, son in law, from Conewago Twp. Account filed 15 Dec 1824 showed balance of \$504

Anna Maria outlived George Kann and a Gazette newspaper account of 2 Dec 1823 states that Mrs. Anna Mary Conn, of Conewago Township died on 24 Nov 1823. It appears that after George died in 1820 that she moved from Dover Twp. to Conewago Twp.
