- A, 250 My 19, 1762. Estate of [George] Michael Konn; Barbara and Henry Konn, administrators. Tenet in £600. Inventory dated Ap 14, 1762. Account filed Ag 19, 1766, shows balance of £185.16.2, distributed between the widow Barbara, issue George, Maudlin, Michael, Elizabeth, Catharine, John, Henry, Peter. (Orphans Court Dockets B,120.) Guardians (Henry and Michael Konn of Hellen Township, Philip Gouff of Dover Township) are appointed for his minor issue Maudlin, Michael, Elizabeth, Catharine John (all above 14) and Henry and Peter (both under 14.) Barbara is mother of at least Henry and Peter. (Orphans Court Dockets B,121.) Petition sets forth that he left 200 acres in Dover Township. (Orphans Court Dockets B,131; N 25, 1766.) Lands valued at £140., decreed to son George (Orphans Court Dockets B,137; Mr 26, 1767.)
- 2A, 118 Q 31, 1797. Estate of Jacob Kann of Manchester Township; John Ernst, administrator. Tenet in \$300. Widow's renunciation filed. Account filed N 20, 1801 shows a balance of £5.1.2. On petition of his widow Eve, Henry Shaeffer is appointed guardian of the decedent's issue Elizabeth (aged 7), Catharine (5). (Orphans Court Dockets H,200; Je 24, 1801.) Guardian's account shows a balance of \$282.39 (N 10, 1820).
- 2F, 600 S 8, 1820. Estate of George Kann Sr. of Dover Township; George (of York) and Jacob Kann (of Dover Township), administrators. Tenet in \$2500. Widow's renunciation filed. Inventory filed Q 28, 1820. Account filed Q 9, 1821 shows a balance of \$4,509.40. Petition read N 6, 1820 states that he owned 160 acres in Dover Township, left a widow Anna Mary, and 17 children:

VI SERVICES IN THE REVOLUTION

1. Adam Conn of York County, aged 20 years, enlisted F 8, 1776 in Captain David Grier's Company, Sixth Pennsylvania Battalion, which took part in the invasion of Canada;<sup>1</sup> he (like others of this battalion) reënlisted (Ja 5, 1777) and served in the Seventh Pennsylvania Regiment at least until he was paid off at Carlisle, Ap, 1781.<sup>2</sup> He appears to have served in Captain William Alexander's company in 1777 and 1778, probably until Ap or My, 1779,<sup>3</sup> but when discharged was a member of Captain Samuel Kennedy's company.<sup>4</sup> The Seventh Regiment was engaged at Brandywine, Paoli, and Germantown during his period of service.<sup>5</sup>
2. James Conn, private in Captain Moses McClean's company, Sixth Pennsylvania Battalion, Ja-Je, 1776, which took part in the invasion of Canada.<sup>6</sup>
3. Diter Conn of York Town, private in Captain William Bailey's company, First Battalion, York County Associators, according to a return dated Je 14, 1776.<sup>7</sup>
4. George Michael Kann of Newberry Township, private in the Third Class, First (Captain William Aston) Company, Second Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 17, 1778.<sup>8</sup>
5. Michael Kann of Newberry Township, private in the Sixth Class, First (Captain William Aston) Company, Second Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 17, 1778.<sup>8</sup>
6. Michael Kann of Dover Township, private in the Second Class, Third (Captain John Schaeffer) Company, First Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 11, 1778.<sup>9</sup>

9. George Kann of Dover Township, private in the First Class, Third (Captain John Schaeffer) Company, First Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 11, 1778;<sup>9</sup> he remained a member of this unit when (in 1780) it became the First (Captain Peter Spiess) Company, Sixth Battalion, in which capacity he paid exercise fines incurred 1781-1782 amounting to £1.16.0.<sup>12</sup> On F 2, 1778 he was paid £66. for hauling militia baggage.<sup>13</sup> Member of the Fifth Class of the Inhabitants of Dover Township, classified under an Act of Assembly passed in 1780, entitled "An Act to compleat the Quota of the Foederal Army;" each class was "required to provide, in fifteen Days from this Date [January 30, 1781], one able-bodied Recruit for the Continental Army, to serve during the War," under penalty of a fine of £15.0.0 specie: this class agreed to find a man.<sup>11</sup>
10. John Kann of Hellen Township, private in the Seventh Class, Fourth (Captain Jacob Hoyer) Company, Second Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 17, 1778;<sup>8</sup> he remained a member of this unit when (in 1780) it became part of the Sixth (Captain Jacob Comfort) Company, Third Battalion,

according to a return for 1781,<sup>14</sup> one for 1782,<sup>15</sup> one which shows that he attended at least 5 successive drills in 1782,<sup>16</sup> and an undated return of the period 1780-1783;<sup>17</sup> in this capacity he paid fines amounting to £1.2.6 in the period Mr, 1780 - Ap, 1783.<sup>18</sup> He saw actual service guarding prisoners of war at Camp Security in York County, D, 1781 - Ja, 1782, in a detachment of the York County Militia under command of Captain Ephraim Pennington; for this service he received £5. pay and £5.10.0 bounty.<sup>19</sup> Member of the Fifth Class of the Inhabitants of Hellam Township, classified under an Act of Assembly passed in 1780, entitled "An Act to compleat the Quota of the Foederal Army;" each class was "required to provide, in fifteen Days from this Date [January 30, 1781], one able-bodied Recruit for the Continental Army, to serve during the War," under penalty of a fine of £15.0.0 specie; this class proved delinquent.<sup>11</sup>

11. John Kann, private, Seventh Class, Eighth (Captain William Wall) Company, Second Battalion, York County Militia, in which capacity he paid fines amounting to £22.10.0 for non-performance of militia duty, in the period 1777-1780.<sup>20</sup>
12. John Kann of York Town, one of the citizens who in Q, 1783 remonstrated against the quartering of Armand's Legion in their homes.<sup>21</sup>
13. Henry Kann Jr. of Hellam Township, private in the Sixth (Captain Jacob Comfort) Company, Third Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return for 1781,<sup>14</sup> one for 1782,<sup>22</sup> one which shows that he attended at least 5 successive drills in 1782,<sup>23</sup> and an undated return of the period 1780-1783;<sup>17</sup> in this capacity he paid fines amounting to £1.2.6, incurred in the period Mr, 1780 - Ap, 1783.<sup>18</sup>

14. Henry Kann of Dover Township, private in the Seventh Class, Third (Captain John Schaeffer) Company, First Battalion, York County Militia, according to a return dated Ap 11, 1778.<sup>9</sup>

Henry Kann of Manchester Township, private in the First Class, Third (Captain Simon Coppenhaffer) Company, Second Battalion, York County Militia, according to an undated return in German, assigned to the period 1777-1780;<sup>24</sup> in this capacity he was fined £30. for non-performance of militia duty in the same period.<sup>25</sup>
